


#### Materials:

#### **Instructions:**



Pass out the God Made Me sheets and lead the children in filling them out.

When they are done have the children share their answers and drawings with you. Discuss how God has made each person different and special.

### **Donkey Puppet**


Make your own donkey puppet and act out Howie's story.


### Materials:


Copy of donkey picture from Crayons Scissors Cardstock Glue Craft stick Tape


### **Instructions:**









# **Howie's Double Word Puzzle**
